DISQUALIFICATION FROM MEMBERSHIP

The restrictions detailed below disqualify the following from becoming school governors:

- people aged under 18;
- people who have been prohibited, or restricted, from working with children, or young people;
- people who have been disqualified from being the proprietor, or teacher, or employee of an independent school;
- people who have been convicted of a crime (in the United Kingdom, or abroad (please see note below) and who have been sentenced to:
 - ❖ three months' imprisonment, or more (whether suspended, or not/ without the option of a fine) within the last five years; or
 - ❖ two and a half years' imprisonment, or more, within the last twenty years; or
 - ❖ five years' imprisonment, or more, at any time;
- people who have been convicted of an offence on school premises and have been fined within the last five years;
- undischarged bankrupts;
- people who have been disqualified from being company directors under:
 - ❖ a disqualification order, or disqualification undertaking under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986,
 - ❖ a disqualification order under Part 2 of the Companies (Northern Ireland) Order 1989, or
 - ❖ a disqualification undertaking accepted under the Company Directors Disqualification (Northern Ireland) Order 2002, or
 - ❖ an order made under section 429 (2) (b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 (failure to pay under county court administration order).
- people who have been disqualified from acting as a trustee for a charity by the Charity Commissioners, or the courts;
- people who are detained under the Mental Health Act 1983; and
- people who refuse to apply to the Disclosure and Barring Service for a criminal records certificate when requested by the clerk.

Please note:

- This list is only a summary. Please phone the Principal, in confidence, if you are unsure whether the disqualification applies to you.
Criminal convictions and sentences of imprisonment have the same effect whether they took place in the United Kingdom, or abroad, unless the conviction was for something, which is an offence abroad but not in the UK.
