The tournament was organised by the schools as a way to promote physical activity and good sportsmanship amongst the students.

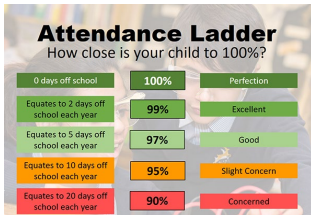
The tournament was a great success, and the pupils had a wonderful time showcasing their skills on the field while also promoting a healthy lifestyle.
