Outwood Primary Diploma

This half term our diploma has focused on the theme: Protect and respect the environment. Many learning opportunities have been explored from EYFS where Nursery children made bird feeders; Year 2 children took part in the RSPB Great British Birdwatch; to Year 5 children who have accepted the challenge of the Woodlands Trust Green School Award. This has involved cross phase communication and learning both inside and outside of the classroom.
